

Selectmen and Board of Assessors meeting minutes for 06/18/2024

In attendance: Willie Ingraham, Joshua Larrabee, Jeffrey Stevens, Ivy Larrabee, Jacky Binette

Meeting called to order at 5:56pm by Joshua Larrabee

Previous meeting minutes were reviewed. Voted all in favored for approval.

The warrants were reviewed and signed.

Expense and Revenue report was reviewed.

Jacky stated all the inspections were done that were on her list. She requested the Selectmen review the notebook and note anything additional they'd like her to look at or correct.

We will be reviewing inground pools for valuation on properties next Tuesday.

Ivy presented the quitclaim deed for review on RE118. The Selectmen had previously signed this per research done on this property. This was a correction on the notarization of the document for the Registry of Deeds. All three Selectmen signed.

Roy came in a spoke on behalf of Sandra for roadside mowing. The Selectmen reviewed previous years payout. We have consistently gone over budget for three years. Roy and the Selectmen agreed to get bids in before the town meeting to ensure we have the correct amount going forward budgeted. All three Selectmen voted in favor of moving forward with this bid. Ivy will contact him to let him know the Selectmen's decision.

UARRC sent a letter for the Selectmen to appoint a second Knox representative in the event Kip Penney would not be able to attend a meeting. Jeff said his wife, Penny Stevens, has shown interest in the past to be involved in this program. The Selectmen all voted in favor of her being our second Knox representative for the recycling center.

Ivy spoke with PP34. He spoke he would not be paying his person property bill. The Selectmen discussed this and will be reach out to him for further discussion.

We received a bid for salt from the state for \$73.85 a ton. Eastern Salt company, formally Harcros, came in at \$85.00 a ton. Josh spoke previously that he would call Eastern and review as he would prefer to stay loyal to a company we've always been with. The owner of Eastern, Jason, told Josh he would match the \$73.85 per ton bid. The Selectmen accepted this.

Mr. Savage came in to review his vehicle registration. Because the plates were transferred vs a new registration, he ended up paying more for the year on his new vehicle. He asked the Selectmen to discuss an excise refund of \$565.38. The Selectmen reviewed the documentation and asked Ivy to call him and meet halfway for an excise refund of \$282.69. Ivy will call him 06.19.2024.

PP67, resident is deceased. The Selectmen voted all in favor of abating this account and deleting once that's completed.
